would have to be satisfied on the single election proposal. It would deal, of course, with school systems that had decided that they wanted to override the levy limits and then they also needed to override the budget limit in order to use the proceeds from the levy vote. So that is the contents of the bill I would like to amend in. But let me again make it clear that what we're doing here is we're drawing back...or returning LB 1213, eliminating its current contents completely, adding this bill to replace it...or excuse me, before we do that, we need to vote to suspend the rules, then we would consider the amendment and then consider a re-advancement. So, with that, I will, if Senator Bohlke would like, offer her time to discuss the current bill as it is.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bohlke, Senator Raikes has yielded you time if you'd like it.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Mr. President, members, the current bill as it is, meaning LB 1213 as it is, no, I have absolutely no desire to discuss LB 1213 as it is. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Raikes, would you like to use the balance of your time?

SENATOR RAIKES: I'll yield that.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek, on the motion to return LB 1213 to Select File.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: On the amendment, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Further debate on the motion to return LB 1213? Senator Raikes, you're recognized to close. Senator Raikes waives closing. The question is, shall LB 1213 be returned to Select File for specific amendment? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is agreed to.
