PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Beutler, I think the fairest response is that I feel strongly about it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Okay, that's all I can think of at the moment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers, on the motion to return.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, when we voted against adjournment, we voted to stay here for a reason. The reason could not be simply to leave everything as it is or we would have adjourned. We knew that there was something else for us to do before we left here tonight, and we know what it is that we are to do. Now there are 14 members in the Omaha "carcass." I'm sure we can gather 16 members from the rural areas because the rural areas need a district judge. Omaha needs a juvenile judge. We may as well start putting together coalitions now. We have to be practical. We don't have enough time to beat around the bush and play delicate footsie games. If we can get 14 votes from Omaha for the juvenile judge, you all certainly can get 16 votes for the district court judge and this money is a way to make it possible for people to vote that way. But even without the money we should be able to put together 30 votes to override that veto of LB 922. The money is not doing anything except sitting. We have things to do. Jesus said let the dead bury the dead. You know what Senator Tyson quoted to me? He and this old Greek writer were out fishing or whatever they did in those days and one of them got a thought and he said, Gene, and Gene said, what is that, well, whatever his Greek name was at that time, he said death plucks my ear and whispers, live, for I am coming. If you shouldn't put off till tomorrow what you can do today, you certainly should not put off to next year what we have a duty to do today. We are the living. We are dealing with the living.
