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where you dealt with an individual with a prepared script who could not deviate from it because he was rigidly following marching orders. I do say to the credit of those who hired Jack that they understood the capabilities of the man and, more or less, gave him free rein, unless he just took that upon himself. But if everybody who represents groups, organizations, individuals could conduct themselves in the way that Jack did, with the professionalism, the knowledge, the understanding of the issues, I, for one, would not have as negative a view of lobbyists as I have. During the time when the state was talking about building a prison, many people don't know the unconscionable pressures that were brought to bear on Jack Mills, as an individual, as a man, as a husband, as, I'll use the term, a lobbyist. Threats were made against him of the kind that I wish he would have allowed me to intervene on his behalf to do something about. But being the kind of man he was and assuming the responsibility for the positions that he took, he never asked certainly and he would not allow me to say or do anything. But I do respect him tremendously for the work that he has done. I don't want this to sound like the kinds of things that are said when a person is gone. I want these things to be said while the man is alive and can hear it. Also, there's not much that I have to say about or on behalf of Norma Mills. They say behind every good man is a good woman. That's not the case in this instance. She is not behind. They walk side by side as a team, showing mutual respect and support. If I continue to go on, somebody who is not aware that both Jack and Norma are still with us, they will look at this and think that we are at a wake or at a cemetery or one of those places, because as one person indicated, more lies are told at funerals than are told at court. But every thing that I'm saying is absolutely true from my position. I mean every word of it, or I wouldn't say it. I don't often get involved in these kinds of affairs, but I have to say with regard to Jack and Norma what the Queen of Sheba said about Solomon. I've mentioned these things, but the half I...
