PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Bromm, recognized to close.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, only...I think those comments were excellent and Senator Lynch was right. Perhaps some amendments would have been appropriate. The bill, as I see the screen, was first here for discussion about the 30th of March. I don't think it was on any of our radar screens until it was a Speaker priority bill and so that's why it came up and simply wasn't...wasn't examined until that time. But, in any event, I think the comments have been...have been enlightening, helpful, and everyone will have to vote what they think is right here. With that, I'd ask leave to withdraw the motion, Lieutenant Governor.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The motion is withdrawn. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk, LB 26.

CLERK: (Read LB 26 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1702.) 36 ayes, 7 nays, 4 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. Mr. Clerk, LB 26A.

CLERK: (Read LB 26A on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1703.) 40 ayes, 2 nays, 5 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.
