SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, I would like a call of the house. I think everyone is here, but at least to go and a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: (Inaudible) order, please; reverse order, please.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The house is under call. Would all unexcused members please return to the Chamber and record their presence. The house is under call. Senator Wickersham, Senator Bohlke, would you check in. Senator Schimek, would you check in. Senator Brown, Senator Robak, would you check in, please. Senator Wehrbein, you requested a reverse order roll call? Mr. Clerk, at your convenience.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1736-1737.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The bill does not become law. I'll raise the call. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Robak would move that LB 1092 become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Robak.
