

AMENDMENTS TO LB 542

1 1. Strike the original sections and insert the following
2 new sections:

3 "Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

4 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill
5 passed by the Ninety-seventh Legislature, First or Second Session,
6 which appropriates funds, FY2000-01 means the period July 1, 2000,
7 through June 30, 2001, FY2001-02 means the period July 1, 2001,
8 through June 30, 2002, FY2002-03 means the period July 1, 2002,
9 through June 30, 2003, FY2003-04 means the period July 1, 2003,
10 through June 30, 2004, and FY2004-05 means the period July 1, 2004,
11 through June 30, 2005.

12 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

13 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2001-02 and
14 FY2002-03, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each
15 program from the respective funds for capital construction
16 projects, land acquisition, lease-purchase arrangements, and major
17 equipment acquisition, except as otherwise appropriated.

18 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2001-02 to
19 FY2002-03.

20 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act,
21 there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation
22 balances existing on June 30, 2002, for FY2002-03 to the respective
23 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as
24 otherwise provided in this act.

1 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

2 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting
3 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk
4 of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the
5 definitions for this act.

6 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

7 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw
8 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount
9 not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon
10 presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall
11 pay the warrants out of the appropriate funds.

12 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
13 appropriation for capital facilities follow an orderly and
14 reasonable process based upon defined and documented need and an
15 analysis of the utilization of existing facilities.

16 The biennial appropriations contained in this act
17 covering FY2001-02 and FY2002-03, which have been designated for
18 planning, require from the agency a complete program statement
19 prepared in accordance with the Procedural Manual for Capital
20 Construction as approved by the state building division of the
21 Department of Administrative Services. Projects directly related
22 to program continuation such as fire and life safety, maintenance,
23 utility improvements, handicapped access, and master planning
24 require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with the
25 manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may be
26 recommended only after submission of an acceptable program
27 statement or statement of needs on or before September 15 to the

1 state building division, the budget division of the Department of
2 Administrative Services, and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

3 Program statements that have been submitted prior to
4 FY2001-02 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the
5 period July 1, 2001, to September 1, 2001. Program statements that
6 have been submitted prior to FY2002-03 shall be updated if
7 necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2002, to
8 September 1, 2002, by agency priority. Such priority shall be
9 subject to final modification by the governing authority of each
10 agency on or before September 15, 2002.

11 Sec. 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that
12 agencies should construct or renovate facilities in such a manner
13 as to provide the greatest cost-effective energy savings possible.
14 Design criteria emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy
15 conservation shall be reflected in program statements, schematic
16 design documents, design development documents, and construction
17 documents. The state building division of the Department of
18 Administrative Services and the State Energy Office shall provide
19 technical assistance to the state agencies, upon request, to assist
20 them in providing for energy-efficient new or renovated facilities.

7 The appropriation to this program is for the purpose of
8 carrying out the provisions of the Deferred Building Renewal Act
9 which includes deferred repair, fire and life safety projects, and
10 compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
11 of 1990. Funds may also be spent on projects related to energy
12 conservation. There is hereby appropriated any available federal
13 funds, plus investment income thereon, for this program for
14 FY2001-02 and FY2002-03. There is included in the appropriation to
15 this program for FY2001-02 an amount not to exceed \$150,000 cash
16 funds and for FY2002-03 an amount not to exceed \$150,000 cash funds
17 to conduct maintenance, life safety, ADA, and energy conservation
18 seminars, to develop preventive maintenance programs, and to
19 perform roof scans and other testing related to the completion of
20 the projects.

21 The funds appropriated in this section for actual
22 deferred repair, fire and life safety, compliance with the federal
23 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and energy conservation
24 shall be matched by federal, private, and agency General, Cash, and
25 Revolving Funds as determined by the Task Force for Building
26 Renewal.

27 None of the funds appropriated to this program shall be

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1 used for operating budget compliance with the federal Americans
2 with Disabilities Act of 1990. Expenditures for deferred repair,
3 fire and life safety projects, and compliance with the federal
4 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 may be made through the
5 same program on the Allotment Status Report in the Nebraska State
6 Accounting System, except that expenditures for deferred repair,
7 fire and life safety projects, and compliance with the federal
8 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 should each be kept
9 separate by subprogram on the Budget Status Report in the Nebraska
10 State Accounting System or through the use of the Grant Project
11 Status Report or some other accounting mechanism.

12 Sec. 57. There is hereby appropriated, unless otherwise

18 reappropriated to the agency and project for which the funds were
19 allocated by the federal government.

20 Sec. 59. GIFTS AND BEQUESTS.

21 Any gifts or bequests made available to the State of
22 Nebraska for any purpose or purposes, together with the income
23 thereof, shall be allocated to the expending agency designated by
24 the donor or, if none is designated by such donor, by the Governor.
25 No matching of state funds shall be required as a condition to
26 accept any gift or bequest. All gifts or bequests of personal
27 property in excess of \$10,000 shall be approved by the Governor

1 before acceptance, and all gifts or devises of real property in
2 excess of \$10,000 to be used for state purposes shall be approved
3 by the Governor and the Legislature before acceptance.

4 Expenditures from gifts or bequests may be expended
5 through any cash fund accounts, in which case the actual amount of
6 the gift or bequest is hereby appropriated to the expending agency
7 for the purpose or purposes designated by the donor and in addition
8 to the amounts appropriated in this act.

9 This section shall not apply to the University of
10 Nebraska.

6 Sec. 62. The Ninety-seventh Legislature acknowledges
7 that Article III, section 22, of the Constitution of Nebraska
8 provides that each Legislature shall make appropriations for the
9 expenses of the government. Consistent with this provision, any
10 appropriations enacted by prior Legislatures for fiscal years
11 beginning after June 30, 2001, are null and void unless
12 specifically reaffirmed by this Legislature.

13 Sec. 63. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2001.

14 Sec. 64. Since an emergency exists, this act takes
15 effect when passed and approved according to law."
