Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The bill creates the Private Detective Licensing Act (Act). The Secretary of State will establish fees for initial and renewal applications for private detectives, private detective agencies, and plain clothes investigators at rates sufficient to cover the cost of administering the Act. The Private Detective Licensing Board is formed to advise the Secretary of State on the administration of the Act and the rules and regulations adopted under the Act.

The bill amends section 71-3205 changing the qualifications to engage in the private detective business. It allows the Secretary of State to deny the license after the investigation by the State Patrol.

The bill would also require proof of continuing education when a license is renewed.
