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SENATOR ENGEL: Well, we're talking about \$5 million a year at the present time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, your...in order, at \$2,000 an answering point for 120-some answering points, it's going to be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...\$25 million...

SENATOR ENGEL: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...by the time you get it done.

SENATOR ENGEL: Well and, of course,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Engel and Senator Beutler. And thank you, Senator Chambers and Senator Beutler. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of committee amendments to LB 585. Senator Engel.

SENATOR ENGEL: I'd just like to...a little more dialogue with...with Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR ENGEL: As far as setting it up centrally like that, first of all, it's going to be much more efficient. And if each...each little area tries to set up their own, they probably will not be able to afford the technology to do it. I mean this is kind of, just like a lot of things we do, you know, Omaha and Lincoln, you're probably going to put in more money than you need. But we also have a lot of other things throughout the state that...that...that the more prosperous communities put in a little more so that we have services out in the...in what you probably call the hinterlands, you know. (Laugh) And so that's what this is, just a more efficient system this way, and it will be afforded to more people throughout the state. So that's basically the only answer I can give you there. I would again recommend that you vote for the committee amendment and the bill. Thank you.
