yes. He said, then this is the other side of the Missouri River. And Patrick had to pay his debt because he didn't listen to the words that were being spoken. What we have to listen to when we deal with this bill is what is being spoken and properly interpret those words. This acupuncture, this needling, is not the practice of medicine. It is not. And I did not say that people would have to be practicing acupuncture in America for thousands of years before they could master it. I said that the fact that people are doing this in America and making an appeal to the fact that it has been practiced for thousands of years does not mean that those practitioners in America have the same skill or know-how, and it doesn't. And the fact that they have to make that kind of an appeal and not tell you that the ones practicing this are going to be those who are immersed in that culture, who have practiced it for decades...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...will be the ones licensed under this bill. Those kind of appeals are made when something cannot stand on its own feet and, in this case, acupuncture, under this bill, cannot walk on its own needles. There is no need for the bill. I don't think we should mislead the public. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Chambers is talking about medical doctors and that acupuncture is not the practice of medicine. We never said that it was, but neither is chiro...neither are chiropractors medical doctors. Senator Chambers admitted, I think in our maybe General round discussion, that he has never had acupuncture, and he admits that he knows nothing about it. But, yet, he's going to dictate to the rest of the people in Nebraska what they can do or can't do when it comes to treating their illnesses. Acupuncture is not perfect; no medium is. I'm having trouble connecting, and we all love the stories and they're very educational and usually entertaining, but I'm having trouble connecting how being on one side of the Missouri River or not, or the other side, connects with this bill.
