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the most demeaning punishment that the Romans could mete out and that's what happened to this man you all say you believe in and worship. And what did he say? Forgive them, not punish them, not do them like they did me, forgive them. And who was he concerned about? The little children. He said, suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not for of such is the kingdom of heaven, not you adults. There may not even be any of you there, but the children will be, the children. And what do you all say about the children? Punish, punish, punish. I couldn't rear my children so, Legislature, you punish them. You give them a criminal conviction that will follow them the rest of their life. You take away their right to drive a car. Then, parents, why do you buy your child a car in the first place? Wouldn't it be better to make it illegal for young people to own cars instead of tricking them into that then using it as an instrumentality to punish, punish, punish? Then you're going to take away their driver's license and throw them in jail for driving under a suspended license. Christians do that--punish, punish, punish. And I say oh no, oh no, oh no. And if all it's going to take for me to prevent this war against our children from reaching a successful...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...conclusion as you would consider it successful, I shall take that time. And I shall win because some of my more naive colleagues think the Legislature will take all this time. Now you know I will consume the time and it helps me because there are other bad bills I don't like that are in committee and that might come out here limping. So let us just continue as we're going this morning, and I assure you I will carry the load alone.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on your motion to reconsider your bracket motion on LB 114.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Sometimes people have an opportunity to nip a thing in the bud, but they don't learn quickly and they have to go over the same thing again and again and again. Old people
