CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bromm would move to amend with FA92.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, you're recognized to open on FA92.

SENATOR BROMM: Mr. Clerk, I'd like to withdraw that amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection, the amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: The next amendment I have, Senator Brashear, AM0705, Senator.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brashear, you're recognized to open on AM0705.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, I'd request leave to withdraw that amendment, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection, the amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Debate on advancement of LB 574? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Bromm did not suffer defeat this morning. What Senator Bromm succeeded in doing is putting me in the position of having to acknowledge that I, on occasion, can be forced to acknowledge a change that I don't particularly like, but I do not see that damage is going to be done by putting this digital system in place, going as far as it does. In a sense, Senator Bromm may have been very cagey in putting in all that other stuff, it may have been a straw person, that I would attack that and be compelled to let the rest of the bill go, when I would have attacked the bill itself if it hadn't been for all that other. So Senator Bromm may be cagey than most people realize, but he and I had discussed our positions on this bill, and I am not
