I'm telling you that there's going to be several reasonable amounts of money that we will not be able to stand come 25th of May. That's all I can tell you. We have several twos and three hundred thousands up here starting to go through. I don't know whether they are or not. It's just...so I can't tell you the right answer today. I just want you to reflect a little bit as you make this decision. Whether some of these predictions will come true, I don't know if they will or won't, but I'm going to start making my stand today. I'm going to vote no on the amendment and I'll vote...I hope...I guess if the A bill, if it does pass and the A bill comes with it, I will stick to my principles and support the A bill if we support this amendment. But I think we need to start considering what is critical and what is not to this year's budget. None of us knows what's going to happen in the next two, or three weeks as far as revenue forecasts. That's my big concern. We're not at this point hurting, based on February 25th forecasts, but there's a lot happening out there in that big world. I've turned particularly pessimistic because what's happening in world trade, which is agriculture; what's happening in the livestock situation with foot and mouth and BSE and all of these things. I can't help but turning pessimistic. But because we're in a world economy, Nebraska's economy is going to follow also. And a lot can happen in the next three or four weeks of what our forecasts could be. It's the unknown that I'm afraid of, it's not the known, but I just want to provide that word of caution here as we head home for this long weekend. Things may not be nearly as pretty next week when we come back. Thanks.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, recognized on the Pedersen amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, notwithstanding Senator Wehrbein's words of caution, I'm going to support Senator Pedersen's amendment. There may be some question in the minds of others as to why this amendment is necessary and whether or not it is already covered by existing statute, so I would ask Senator Pedersen a question.
