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I...

SENATOR TYSON: What I mean is...if I may,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR TYSON: ...you have this now as FA119. You previously had it as AM1113, and AM0987, both of which you withdrew.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

SENATOR TYSON: Could I ask the progression...or, the development of thought or tactic or whatever?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure. When I first introduced the amendment, it had a number of provisions that went to the basic principle of the amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: That would be AM0987?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Pardon me?

SENATOR TYSON: That would be AM0987?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I'd have to look back at my gadget to see the number. It was the very first amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The very first amendment had the living wage provision in it, and it also had several other provisions in it.

SENATOR TYSON: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The OPPD and the public power people came to me and said, you know, we really don't think you should be looking at this part. It's okay. And my opinion was, I probably should be looking at all those parts. But I was on Final Reading, and I had to try to pick out something good I could do at that stage. So I said to them, I'll reduce the amendment just to the living wage portion. And they said,
