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that's fine, we can live with that. I don't think they're opposing that. They certainly didn't indicate to me in any way that they were in opposition to that particular position. So I think they're okay with it. And then...

SENATOR TYSON: Oh, I'm not questioning that, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And then...

SENATOR TYSON: I'm just trying...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...the third amendment was the one I just did for Senator Schrock, which clarified that it applies only to full-time employees.

SENATOR TYSON: Well, I guess my question is, why were they with...why was AM1113 withdrawn?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, which one is AM1113?

SENATOR TYSON: Well, AM1113 is...begins on page 4, after line 11, which is the way...here, let me give you give you all three of these. What I'm interested in, Senator Beutler, is AM0987 was first, and you explained that. You then came back with only the bottom part of it. And then you...then withdrew that. And now on Final...

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, Senator, there's nothing...there's nothing surreptitious about the process.

SENATOR TYSON: I'm not suggesting that. I'm just trying...I just...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. Well, I just...

SENATOR TYSON: I wanted the rationale, I guess.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I just explained to you, the first amendment has been filed for several days. Pursuant to negotiations with the power districts, I withdrew a portion of the amendment. And I refiled the remaining portion, which was the living wage
