Kremer amendment? Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. This bill was heard in the Health and Human Services Committee, and was advanced by a unanimous vote. And actually, the E clause...we had intended to put that on there. And I apologize to Senator Kremer that it did not...was not already on there through an amendment...through the Health and Human Services. I think this is a good solution for all our citizens. It does set up a system of education and mitigation. And it's, I think, the right bill at the right time for here in Nebraska. And I would just endorse its passage before the Legislature. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Chambers on the Kremer amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, not on the emergency clause.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Kremer, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR KREMER: I waive off.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Kremer waives closing. The question is the adoption of AM1181 to LB 668. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kremer's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is adopted. Debate on the advancement of LB 668. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I probably shouldn't read these bills, and I shouldn't read committee statements. But in the committee statement, I see the word "maximum containment level of three hundred picocuries per liter." Is that supposed to be "contaminant"? Oh, let me ask Senator Jensen a question, because he's looking at me.
