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we have a change with respect to the legislative members and also the terms of the other members. Members shall serve until appointment or qualification of their successors. The term of a member appointed from the Legislature, under subdivision (1)(b)(i), which is the makeup of the commission, is...shall terminate when the member ceases to be a member of the Legislature. Then the original bill had a section that allowed this board to go into signed contracts and other agreements. And that has never been a practice. Any contracts entered into on behalf of the Legislative Council have always been approved by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council. We make that provision in Section 4, sub (d). We add that in. Section 5 then, in the original version, provided that the Futures Center executive director would be hired by the Futures Center, but would be paid from the resources of the Legislative Council. And we provided that the executive director shall be hired by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council, with the advice of the Nebraska Futures Center Board, and that he or she shall serve at the pleasure of the Executive Board. Then it goes on in (Section) 5, sub (3), the executive director shall carry out projects as directed by the Futures Center Board, including but not limited to those specified in Section 4. That gives a little broader impact. And then finally, let me find my way through here, we, in the good Nebraska tradition, put a sunset date in the bill of July 1, 2006, so that the Legislative Council could take a look at what had been accomplished by, and make an analysis of the success or lack of success of the Futures Center, and either reauthorize it sometime prior to that date, or it would go out of existence. And finally, an operative date of January 1, 2003, which was an error on my part, and we will follow with an amendment to the committee amendment, changing that to January 1, 2002. And the reason for the delayed implementation is in fact quite mechanical, in that as some of you may have noticed, we're somewhat constrained for space and equipment and those things that are necessary to provide for another executive director, or another division of the Legislative Council. And that's the best comparison, I think, for how this would be put together from the governance standpoint. And this gives us some time to find space, to do all of the things that's necessary in order to have an effective effort when it does come into being and is ready to carry out
