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would try to answer them. With that, I'm proud to introduce this bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Coordsen, you're recognized for a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Just very recently we handed out the...I would suppose the directions, again, for the redistricting plans and how that goes about. Yesterday morning, the Redistricting Committee met and the determination...all of these...all of...this memo has went to your office. I chose to take it out on...put it out on the floor to ensure that everyone had their attention highlighted because it is important that we understand first that there are three subcommittees that will be working on the Board of Regents, State Board of Education, Public Service Commission, Supreme Court. Redistricting Committee, as a whole, will be working on the...the congressional districts, and then all of the body through will be working with the Redistricting Committee on legislative districts. The reason that I put this out, that between now and April 23rd, between now and April 23rd, every member of this body has the opportunity to provide to the Redistricting Committee, either through their group, any member any other suggestions that they might have for redrawing any of the districts of the six elective districts that we have to withdraw...we have to draw. After April 23rd, we will be putting together the committee bill that we'll have the hearing on, on May 5th. The hearing will be on a Saturday and it will be on as many two-way sites in Nebraska as we're able to put together. It will be a video conference type hearing. And the other thing that I need to bring your attention to, that after the committee bill is put together, that there will be, of course, free and ample opportunity for anyone to propose amendments on the floor, but that those amendments must be accompanied by a Bill Drafter version, a legal language version, of the amendment for...if no other reason than to be able to put in the daily Journal and a map so it's clearly understood by everyone on the floor.
