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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. One other question then. The...we end up, and Senator Foley has already addressed this, we end up with a Cash Reserve under this scenario of \$78 million, a balance, Cash Reserve balance of \$78 million. In your opinion, is that adequate? What...what is an adequate number?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Raikes, I don't know what an adequate number is. Actually, my personal preference for me a few year...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you. Did you say "time"?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I did, Senator.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Schimek, followed by Senator Beutler and Thompson. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members. I rise with some questions and I...and some mixed emotions about one provision of this, and that is the...the teacher loan forgiveness program, and I...I guess maybe we'll all have to wait and see what happens on LB 305, Senator Wehrbein. But, first of all, as I understand it, it's \$2.7 million a year and \$2,000 to each recipient each year, and eligible for how many years?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And do I need to ask Senator Thompson some of these questions?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, I...we did not go into much detail on that. I have it here. Two thousand five hundred dollars each year for up to five years.
