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and the teacher grabbed the child and, in flailing, the child hit the teacher. And the child was suspended and the Nebraska Supreme Court said appropriately so. So here are these kids sitting up here listening to this man say he would have killed this child, and nothing is done. That's the kind of stuff I'm talking about. The schools won't do anything about it. What did "Deep Throat" tell me? Follow the money. And then I know what to do after that. After I follow the money, cut it off. And if you all are going to help Omaha get theirs, I'm going to try to cut some of yours off, too. And if I can't cut your money off, I can take a lot of your time, and I intend to do it. They have not, in OPS system, had to deal with me on these terms before. When Senator Schimek mentioned teachers writing tests, and it's a local control issue, I'm sure the local school board said that's the way they want it. They don't want the state dictating, so they ask for these kind of things. On this red sheet Senator Thompson gave us, it talks about how many teachers are going to retire in seven to ten years. Teachers wanted early retirement, the Legislature gave it to them, so that's a bed that the Legislature made will now lie in it. Give them what they want, then it becomes an argument for something else. I read in the paper when Mackiel was down here demonstrating with these teachers over the weekend that he said this boisterous, political demonstration or protest is needed. Well, suppose the students engage in a boisterous, political protest. I keep his words and I'm going to use them when they want to take these harsh positions against children then excuse the adults. I was talking about that the other day when Senator Kremer had a bill, how lenient we are to adults, how forgiving, then we're going to lower the hammer on the kids. The teacher can say, I would have killed him if they hadn't taken him. If the kid said if they hadn't taken me to the principal's office, I would have killed him, talking about the teacher, would it have been just spaced off? No.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Nobody knows how to deal with these situations but I'm going to find a way, and don't tell me it's not the best way because you have shown me no way and the opportunity has been there because the school system in Omaha
