has, I will continue to resist it. And because Senator Bruning will hurt the bill, I've got to support Senator Bruning's amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bruning, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I wholeheartedly disagree with the senior member that this will hurt the bill. I...I couldn't disagree more and I wish he were on the other side of this particular argument (laugh), frankly. While it's always nice to have some support, the senior member's support in this instance (laughter) has caused everybody to think twice. I really think, I truly believe this amendment helps the bill. We're going to have a General Fund crunch. We're going to get to Select File and people are going to say there's not \$3 million a year to get this done; where we going to find the money? I'm offering you a chance. There is no magic in the current size of the LUST Fund, no magic at all. I sat...I've sat on the Natural Resources Committee for five years. When we upped it from six-tenths of a cent on gasoline to nine-tenths, there's no magic. Basically, we took a look at the possible liability here, and this is...in no way do I mean to show a lack of respect for Senator Bromm's efforts on the bill, but we looked here and we saw this huge liability, and we said, we're not getting it done fast enough, let's bump up the LUST Fund a little bit. There was no magic, there was no in-depth study that said this is exactly the right amount to get it done in the right amount of time. There's no magic to \$10.5 million a year in leaking underground storage tank cleanup, zero magic at all. Why did we arrive at that number? Who knows. We don't know; we just knew we weren't getting it done fast enough. What I'm offering is a way, I believe, to make sure the ethanol bill passes. Right now with a \$3 million fiscal note it's going to be a struggle when we get to Select File and people are forced to choose between different things they care about. So, notwithstanding the senior member's arguments that this will hurt the bill, I disagree and I would urge the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.
