them in a classroom. I'm not expelling them for things that an adult can do and nothing will be done about it. And I have another specific situation that I touched on before...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that I'm going to touch on again where a gym teacher at Northwest High, where a lot of black kids go, made a death threat toward a black student and nothing was done. But if the student made a death threat toward the gym teacher...not even to the gym teacher. There are kids who have been picked up because they were in a conversation that was overheard by somebody, and somebody construed what they said as being perhaps a threat. Nobody was named; no specific person was identified. Children have written essays as part of an exam or an assignment, and because of things they said, they were brought before the police in some instances. They have been expelled. Then a gym teacher can do this, he's white, and nothing is done, and you think I care about the public schools? And when you-all, who love the public schools and support them, go along with this kind of stuff, there is nothing that we have in common. Nothing. You want to oppress; I want to stop the oppression. Mr. President, I will ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: There has been a request to place the house under call. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: House is under call. All members please return to the Chamber, record your presence. The house is under call. Members, please check in. (Visitors introduced.)
