SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So next session I promise to bring a bill in here to abolish that PEAP program, but I don't know what committee can hear it. I don't think we have a church committee here. I don't know which committee can hear it. Will it go to the Education Committee? It probably ought to come to the Judiciary Committee, and I can probably draft it in such a way as to send it there. I don't believe that I am being unreasonable by saying you will give these church operations \$150,000 more dollars on top of what they're getting already. They're getting millions of dollars already. And at the same time, putting \$600,000 total in the pot that public school students will have access to. But the churches will still have access to that \$600,000, too.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I hope you will vote for this amendment. I'll ask for a call of the house, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers, I just...Senator Chambers, I just got up in the chair. Were you closing?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It wasn't my intent if I had another time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: You do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, because of the agenda, I'm going to switch over now at this point in time. Items for the record?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Thank you, Mr. President. A new resolution, LR 69, offered by Senator Bruning, proposes an interim study. A letter from the Governor indicating that LB 358, LB 362, LB 398, LB 398A, LB 664, LB 668, LB 668A, LB 678 have been signed and
