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SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. When was the last time you saw six snowplows in a row?

SENATOR JONES: I haven't. I'm lucky to see one go by my place, let alone six of them. (Laugh)

SENATOR JANSSEN: There you go, that's what I...what I'm getting at, but I can't, you know, and if we're...if we're going...thank you, Senator Jones. We are going to appropriate...appropriate this kind of money to...for these buildings and they are not going to cost that much, I think I heard Senator Wehrbein say that they...they ask for more money than they are really going to need, and then they will have money left over for other projects, I certainly hope somewhere along the line that that money is accounted for and it's not something that it is just going into a slush fund somewhere. So if they ask for an appropriation of \$500,000 for a building and they use \$250,000, and that other quarter of a million dollars is going to go, or that other \$250,000 is going to go into a bridge project somewhere, and they've appropriated an extra amount of money for that certain bridge and overappropriated on that, it seems to me that they are going down a kind of a Catch-22 situation where they've always got just a little bit more money than what they really need until it comes time that you need a drainage ditch cleaned out along a highway right-of-way, there is never any money for that project. You have to appropriate that money somewhere along the line. We don't have money for that. So I...Senator Coordsen, I think you may have opened up a little bit of a can of worms here, and I think we should keep looking into that can of worms and see if there isn't a dead mackerel in the bottom of that can of worms somewhere. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: At this time, Mr. Speaker, I would like to withdraw those amendments, and I would follow with another motion.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The amendments are withdrawn. Senator Coordsen, you are recognized for a motion to recess.
