SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the reopening on FA233 to LB 620. Open for discussion. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Chambers, I've got a few things I want to visit with you about as we work through this. One is I'm...I'm not sure...I mean I have an understanding of what I think a genetic test is, but I also have an opinion as to what a reasonable person is, too, and that can vary from person to person. What is a genetic test, statutorily defined?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't believe it is...I don't know that it is statutorily defined anywhere right now.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: If...and the other part is, I don't know the difference between genetic testing and genetic screening. And what...what I have to fall back, I did take a look at the bill that Senator Brown referred to last night. If we take out genetic testing and genetic screening and use that definition of genetic test and say that that isn't...is that something that's acceptable?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: At least it gives me a definition...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Because I'm a little unsure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.
