Legislature, I'm thankful for the debate this morning. I understand the consternation some of my rural colleagues have. I did this because I made a bargain with a man. One of our state senators wanted to know about this on General File and I said I'll have an amendment on Select that will take care of this, so that's why we're here. I'm fulfilling my part of the bargain and I do think that it does stop what we call double-dipping. With that, I'd ask for your support of the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Dierks. The question is the adoption of AM1695 to LB 620. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Voting on the Dierks amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would members please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Would those members in the Chamber please record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Schrock, could you please record your presence.
