was mentioning work that others had done on this specific bill. On LB 620, the railroad bill, we took language from her LB 432 and used that as a basis for prohibiting involuntary or coerced genetic testing of employees by those companies. There is a spillover from her bill into what we're doing here, and I just want to acknowledge that too. You all had better enjoy this afternoon, because we're getting into the tail end of the session and you will not see me behave like this any more this session and perhaps not again like this while I'm a member of this Legislature, unless on my bill to abolish the death penalty there is as much unanimity on that as there is on this one.
