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three or five or fifteen because decisions are made that are not always popular. But if they are made fairly and in the practical sense they are the right thing, then the individuals have to accept it. I think in practical sense if you put people there that, as I indicated earlier, have a strong knowledge of appraisal work and understand how you arrive at values and can put some people with legal background in the mix, you can come up with a board that I think can do a good job. I'm not saying the board that is there now isn't doing a good job, because that's not the popular thing to say, but everybody knows there has been some criticism, and whether it's deserved or not, is not my...is not my judgment. I never had anything before the TERC board. When I was on the county board, we weren't popular in times that we were denying people the relief that they thought they were entitled to. It was a case where we thought we were right, and they thought they were right, and ne'er the twain shall meet. It is just one of those issues that you can't avoid when you're trying to deal with other people's...other people's pocketbook and, basically, that's what's happening in the field of appraisal work. So I'm willing to go along, in essence, with the...with the idea of going to five members on the TERC board.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I think it might be more advantageous to have more heads together and, as again...but, again, I would say that I would not say that they all had to be attorneys in order to accomplish the task of doing a good job of doing the appraisal work that needs to be done in the field...in the field that we're in. So with those few comments, I'll stop now and turn the rest of my time back to the Chair, and sit back and listen and see what develops out of this whole process. With that, Mr. President, I thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Jones, on the Landis amendment.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, we keep talking about the TERC board here and all attorneys but I think we've got the TERC board right here in the next aisle behind me
