PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would members please return to the Chamber and check in. A roll call vote in regular order has been requested by Senator Coordsen. The house is under call. Senators Chambers, Connealy and Cunningham, the house is under call. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: As the sponsor of the amendment, can I ask for a reverse order, or is it first call on that?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein, you can object, as the introducer of the amendment, but Senator Coordsen has indicated that he will...he's requesting a record vote, doesn't care what order it is. So,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would like to ask for reverse order then, please.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Okay, we'll do it in reverse order. Senator Chambers, the house is under call. Senator Wehrbein, at this point, we can't locate Senator Chambers. All right, the roll. Mr. Clerk, roll call vote in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 1918-1919.) 23 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Wickersham would move to adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is, shall the Legislature adjourn? Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The Legislature is adjourned.
