provide the funding for those programs. On the last page of that fiscal note there is a total fiscal impact statement, which I think very closely parallels the one you were handed in the LB 305 discussion. So I won't...I won't spend a lot of time, but if you have questions I'd be happy to try to address them. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Raikes. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk, item on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to indefinitely postpone LB 305A. Senator Raikes, you would have the option to lay the bill over, Senator.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: We'll take it up.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your motion to indefinitely postpone LB 305A.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, this is the most insidious part of what the Legislature has done to date on LB 305. The bill passing will not have any significant consequences if the A bill does not accompany it. I'd like to ask Senator Raikes a few questions.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Raikes, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, do you have your copy of the A bill handy?
