LB 305A

Mr. President. I would ask for a call of the house.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Been a request for a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The house is under call. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Unexcused senators report to the Chamber. The house is under call. Members, would you please check in. House is under call. Would you check in, please, Senator Beutler. Senator Brown, the house is under call. All present or accounted for, the question before the body is, shall...the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 305A. All in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 305A. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk. Record vote requested. A record vote has been requested.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal pages 1922-1923.) Vote is 1 aye, 29 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion to indefinitely postpone was not successful. Mr. Clerk. I do raise the call.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend. (FA242, Legislative Journal page 1923.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this motion would strike Section 1 from the A bill. That vote that was just recorded, 29 against 1, shows the splendid isolation in which any black person will always be found who is speaking in behalf of black people and the interests of black people. You only got 29 votes. That's not
