SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...be the effect of this bill. So I believe we ought to strike this money from the bill. SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, I'm going to offer you a trade. Are you interested in at least hearing it, what the offer would be?

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm...I'm...I'm interested, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If I will give you LB 305, will you give me, in exchange, LB 305A?

SENATOR RAIKES: That...that is more generous than you usually are, Senator, but, no, I wouldn't do that.
