CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal pages 2052-2053.) 35 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 536.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, items for the record? Actually, first, let me recognize the Speaker while we remain under call. Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thanks, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Tomorrow at one-thirty, we're going to take up the override motions on the line-item vetoes of the mainline budget bill and the capital construction bill. Just to refresh your recollection, pursuant to the rule, they've met, the Appropriations Committee has met. They've filed their motions and their recommendations, and they will go first. Once that is done, then we're...we'll take up any other motions to override, if there are any. But tomorrow is going to be the day to do that. After we have dealt with those motions to override, I will then direct the Clerk to take the bill over to the Secretary of State's Office. So if you have motions to override, the issue is tomorrow is the day we're going to do that and we'll not hold those bills over for a number of days. We will just do them tomorrow. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have motions by the Appropriations Committee pursuant to the report filed earlier (re LB 542 and LB 543). Senator Wickersham, an amendment to LB 305 to be printed. (Legislative Journal pages 2053-2054.)

Mr. President, a priority motion, Senator Kristensen would move to adjourn until nine o'clock, Wednesday morning, May 16.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is, shall the Legislature adjourn? Those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. We are adjourned.
