friend, and this friend knows what it means to be gay, and will spread the word, and now that child is a pariah, betrayed by a person who was thought to be a friend. When you get into religious circles and you talk about Jesus and Judas, you get all teary-eyed about the way Jesus was betrayed. But that may have happened and it may not have happened, but there is not the same concern when actual children who live among us right now are betrayed by a friend, and set upon by society in a way worse than that in the case of Jesus. Teachers are not supportive. Administrators are not supportive. And when an effort is made to create some kind of support system for these children, the adults jump in and they add their viciousness, their dyed-in-the-wool hat indelible viciousness and encourage children to be cruel and even brutal to other children because of their sexual orientation. These kinds of subjects are not discussed on the floor if I don't bring them up because my colleagues want to pretend they don't happen. That's why I think it is so hypocritical what is said about paying these teachers and doing so much for the schools. Unconscionable things go on in these schools and the children are not the focal point. Do you know when the children become a focal point? When, let's say that President Kennedy, I meant former President...former President Clinton misbehaves, and these hypocrites who come from states where they have common law marriage, that means you shack up long enough and you're treated as legally married, that Congressman Barr, who has been married and divorced several times, the leader of the effort to get a federal law against same-sex marriage. All of them talking about, well, the children, you can't have same-sex marriage, what will the children think? Well, what do the children think in your state when if the people down the street are shacking up and they shack up long enough so that they are considered married and the kids know what common law marriage means. You don't have to get married to somebody, you just stay with somebody and have babies and live with them, and that's as good as anything else. That's what common law marriage is. That's what's happening in most of these southern states where those strongest Christians, so-called, come from. Many of those Congressmen have been married and divorced and married again and divorced. Look at Newt Gingrich, wife on her deathbed, they thought because she had cancer. He dumped her for a younger
