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I've told them there's only three things that I support. One is the loan forgiveness, which is already in the budget; secondly, lifting the spending limits; and the third, leaving it up to local school districts to make it their priority rather than us deciding what they will do locally. So this particular amendment is a good amendment and I hope you will support it. It's a little less than what we would...they would get if we lifted the entire spending limit that they have, but I think it's a very, very, very good compromise. We've got...it's something that I think we...if we pass this amendment and it goes along with the bill, I think we can say that we have definitely done something for the teachers in our state. So, again, this is what I've been telling them all year long. It's all I could support. I could not support a sales income...a sales tax increase and I think if we leave it up to the local districts and where they definitely prioritize teacher salaries as being a super priority then I think we should do that also. So that's about all I really want to say about this because Roger, Senator Wehrbein, has explained the...his amendment here and at this time, if Senator Wehrbein would like to have any more time, I'd be glad to give him more time. Senator Wehrbein?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein, you have approximately three and a half minutes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm going to pass at this point. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: I would move to adjourn until 1:30.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, what I assumed you were telling me is that you'd like the Clerk to read some items in and then you'd like to recess until 1:30.

SENATOR RAIKES: Didn't you hear me say that? (Laughter)

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That...that's what the Chair heard and we'll accept that as soon as the Clerk reads some items in.
