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SENATOR JANSSEN: ...you're supposed to pay the sales tax on it.

SENATOR BOURNE: So, in response to these dozens and dozens of...and I'm sure you've gotten the same ones, and the phone calls and...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I think, yeah, they're coming from...from just actually two people, who I think have clients that are...

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...egging them on.

SENATOR BOURNE: So you don't see any way that these individuals, if they like a particular wine or beer from a particular group, or a particular manufacturer of that substance, who is small enough that they don't necessarily ship to "ABC Liquor Store", the liquor store on the corner...I mean, what I'm concerned about is we shouldn't tax an entity such that our citizens can't obtain this product. And that's kind of their argument; that we're going to impose such a large tax on some of these wineries that they're just not going to ship into Nebraska.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, if they, Senator Bourne, if they are any business at all, and I'm sure they're sending enough into this state right now, or they wouldn't be concerned about it, that they would pay that tax.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. Well, I appreciate your clarification. I, you know, I understand exactly where you're coming from. You don't...you want people to be taxed on things that come into the state, and I can appreciate that. But it does seem to me that we're going to have some accessibility issues. But I do appreciate your clarification. And I was there when you said to Senator Hilgert that you would study this over the summer...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...and I appreciate that as well, although I
