put together the first time around. I had filed AM2013 on General File and, at the request of Senator Wickersham, decided to advance that to a Select File amendment to give some additional time to work out some things and also to address some of the ideas that some of the other affected senators had. So that is why this says "Legislative Proposal B", because it's the second proposal from AM2013. And you should have a copy of the blue sheet that I had handed out, in addition to a map, on each desk that proposes what's going to happen here. If you live east of Dawson County you're not affected by what my amendment does. Essentially what this is, is a map to try and correct or to make the map of western Nebraska a little more better in the minds of a lot of...a lot of us out there. What we are essentially doing is, if you follow along on...on the blue sheet, we're going to add Gosper County to District 38; we're going to add Perkins County back to District 44. The proposal is to add Banner and Arthur County back into District 47, and to take District 49 to the precinct lines. And so, as you look through the...through the sheet, and we talked about a lot of these things already through the first round of debate on the redistricting as far as community of interest, as far as the deviations being identifiable to the voters, and I have outlined on here exactly what is...what is proposed in my map. You see District 38 adds Gosper County. The deviation is only one percent compared to a negative five percent that the committee put forward. The Erdman amendment, AM2095, would reunite some communities of interest ranging from NRDs to county agents, as far as government entities, and also gives a little better representation of the area that is there. District 43 has no major changes; however, with the adoption of AM2095, there will only be two towns in the entire district that will be in the Mountain Time Zone and most people do know that there is a second time zone in the state of Nebraska and I think that that would be something that should be welcomed and I think Senator Jones is very supportive of...I know Senator Jones is very supportive of this map. District 44 does add Perkins County back into the district, which has been there for the past ten years and possibly longer, I'm not sure, but I know for the past ten years, which gives Senator Baker's district, District 44, a deviation of one percent compared to a negative two percent that was put forward by the committee.
