

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR FOLEY: Would I be fair to you if I said that you were pro-choice?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't characterize myself any kind of way. I characterize myself as "pro-female".

SENATOR FOLEY: Absolutely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and somebody does it against her will.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, that should not be legal.
