bill to clarify that esthetics relate to the application or use of certain apparatus or preparations upon the skin. The amendment requires that one esthetician rather than an owner of the school of esthetics be appointed to the Board of Cosmetology under Section 71-374 and requires the State Board of Health to make such appointment by October 1, 2001. In Section 23, the amendment deletes the reference to a 300 credit requirement for licensure as an esthetic instructor but retains the 300 hour requirement beyond the program of study required for licensure as an esthetician. The amendment changes the required instructor-to-student ratio for schools of cosmetology, esthetics and electrology in Section 29 of the bill from one to twenty to one to six and restores the reference to freshman students which is being changed to first-year students in the bill. That is what the amendment does, and I could proceed to the amendment to the amendment at this time, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Clerk. Announce it, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Jensen would move to amend the committee amendments with AM2333. (Legislative Journal page 283.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. You may open on that amendment, Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you. All the amendment does is change the date that is in the committee amendment from 1 October, 2001, to 1 October, 2002. That is the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Open for discussion on the amendment to the committee amendments. Seeing no lights on, Senator Jensen, would...Senator Jensen waives closing. The question before the body is the amendment to the committee amendments to LB 241. All in favor of that vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on AM2333 to the committee amendments. Have you all voted who care to? Please vote if you care to. Record, please, Mr. Clerk.
