Kristensen, do you wish to close?

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** My closing would be that I appreciate your attention to this matter. It's one that I think we ought to be careful of and I'll take it over to Select File and we'll kind of hang on to it and see if it's something we need to do. Thank you.

**SENATOR CUDABACK:** Thank you, Senator. You've heard the closing on LB 712. The question before the body is, shall LB 712 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the advancement of LB 712. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

**CLERK:** 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 712.

**SENATOR CUDABACK:** LB 712 does advance. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

**CLERK:** Mr. President, LB 830 is a bill by Senator Bromm. (Read title.) Introduced on January 17 of last year, referred to the Transportation and Telecommunications for hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments at this time, Mr. President.

**SENATOR CUDABACK:** Senator Bromm, you're recognized to open on LB 830.

**SENATOR BROMM:** Thank you, Senator Cudaback. The essence of this bill rises out of our change to the alphanumeric system in Douglas, Lancaster and Sarpy Counties and requests by persons that have pickups, pickup trucks in those counties that have commercial plates, it might say 2-COMMERCIAL 5785 would be a good example, and after this change those pickup owners are unable to pay the additional fee and keep that commercial plate because it has too many caricatures for a personalized message plate. So this simply allows for the continuation, if they choose to do so, of the pickup owners in Lancaster, Douglas and Sarpy Counties, alphanumeric counties, to continue to pay the additional fee and keep their number that they have had maybe
