when felonies and misdemeanors both are involved. Finally, Section 17 of the amendment deals with the Nebraska Criminal Justice Information System. The Commission on Public Advocacy, the Lancaster Public Defender's Office...Lancaster County Public Defender's Office, and the Nebraska State Patrol have all agreed on and are supportive of amending the definition of administration of criminal justice to include public defenders. That's logical. We pay...we...we create, we pay for, and we fund public defenders. Of course they're a part of the criminal justice system. The amendment gives access to information including Nebraska criminal histories, and the Department of Motor Vehicle records. It blocks access to other restricted information that should not, and would not, be made available to public defenders. And it limits access to full-time public defender's offices and to the Commission on Public Advocacy created by this Legislature. That constitutes the content of the omnibus Criminal Justice Act for this new millennium, which your committee put together, worked hard on, and now submits to you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...hopefully, for your...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...favorable reaction. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments to LB 82. Mr. Clerk, further amendments?
