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SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: No, but I would...I would not be surprised.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Bruning a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bruning, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bruning, all these...

SENATOR CUDABACK: I do...I do not...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Mary...

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...I do not see...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, here he is.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Here he comes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: While he comes to his desk, while talking about all these Mary Smiths that you're mentioning who nobody can locate, are you aware that the State Patrol does not take Social Security numbers on their citations?

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do they deal with these Mary Smiths that you're talking about? Do they never ticket one of these Mary Smiths and only the Omaha police?

SENATOR BRUNING: No, they ticket them. They do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that the information that officers get for going on a ticket comes off the driver's license? Are you aware of that?

SENATOR BRUNING: Yes.
