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themselves of it. I would say in every one of the cases of the programs that I have talked to you...that these programs that I have listed, their number of training hours for themselves and for anyone else that works for them is so far in excess of what we're talking about in this bill that it would boggle your mind. I happen to know that the provider in Papillion that...that is a family...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BROWN: ...child-care provider received something like 300 hours last year. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Erdman.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members, I think Senator Tyson has hit the nail on the head here, but I have a...a different reason or the same reason I guess for supporting the recommit because, frankly, I've never voted for the bill, committee, General File. I don't plan on voting it here. If for some act of God it would advance, I won't vote for it there. But I think we should refer it to the Health Committee and rename the Health Committee the child care committee. We have one, two, three, four, five, six, seven different bills held in committee right now, either been introduced this year or from last year, and I think what we need to do is, since we're sending...spending \$60 million a year, \$60 million a year, for day care, let's send the bill back to committee, look at all nine bills and say, you know what, let's have a comprehensive solution to the problem. But evidently we don't want to do that. We just want to have a little piecemeal, we want to advance things, on and on. The other thing that I think has been lost in this, if you look at the fiscal note this is not included, and it's the cost to the...to the 3,397 child-care homes in Nebraska to comply with LB 400. Granted, there are some who are already above that, there are probably some who are right at that, but as you add the additional responsibility you add to the bottom line of the home. And the figure that was presented to me by the...by the providers in the state of Nebraska is \$2,360,000. So not only is this going to be a cost to the state but obviously we know, with additional regulations,
