the eye, will tell you makes it a human being in progress. If you were going to define this whatever it is in the womb that you want to define I believe something should be in the definition related to the size, namely something which is visible or would be visible to the naked eye. What we are talking about in this bill as it exists now is something smaller than the period at the end of the sentence on any document you have before you and are reading. And if that which is smaller than that period is taken out of existence, first-degree murder can have been committed. As Senator Wickersham and others pointed out, a criminal law, which purports to create a crime, which cannot be prosecuted is not good legislating. There is never going to be a prosecution for the killing, if you allow me to use that term, of a zygote, of an embryo at a very early stage of development. That is not going to happen. That's why this language is put there, not for the purpose of creating an enforceable criminal statute based on the commission of a crime which can be determined. The purpose is to put a dogmatic doctrinal statement...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...into the criminal statutes. When Senator Foley says that I have voted to put this "unborn child" language into the statutes, I have voted for bills which contained it when the bills were designed to help women. There was no way to get it out of the statute, just like we can't get it out now. But as far as adopting a definition from the House of Representatives is concerned, the House passed a so-called partial-birth abortion bill after which Nebraska patterned it...its, but I was more right than Congress, Senator Foley. So if you multiply one idiot by four hundred and thirty-five, you have four hundred and thirty-five idiots, or an idiot to the four hundred and thirty-fifth degree, or however way you want to say it. Just because you multiply the number of dumbbells in a room doesn't mean by clumping them together you produce an intelligent person. Thank you, Mr. President.
