CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. There are four proposed appointments to the Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards. This board acts on, as the name would indicate, developing and approving standards for the various roads that are designed and constructed in Nebraska, and also if there should be a request to change classification of a road from, example, a county road to a state road, they would act upon that request. And so I would like to submit to the body the names of Dean Lux, L-u-x, who is a new proposed appointee. Mr. Lux is from North Bend, Nebraska. He has some experience in Dodge County with roads and has served in various capacities in Dodge County for many years, including the Dodge County Board of Supervisors. We have another new appointee by the name of Alan Doll, D-o-l-l, and Mr. Doll would be from Blair, Nebraska, and he also has a considerable amount of experience. He's certainly qualified. He is serving as a county highway superintendent in Washington County and I believe he has served in that capacity perhaps in Thayer County as well. So we...we'd recommend Mr. Doll. Those are new appointees. Two reappointments; one would be Arthur Yonkey, Y-o-n-k-e-y. He has been on the Board of Classifications and Standards since 1993. Mr. Yonkey is from Hickman, Nebraska. He is employed as a project development engineer with the Nebraska Department of Roads and brings some technical expertise to this board. Another reappointment would be Gene Acklie, A-c-k-l-i-e. He's from Scottsbluff, Nebraska, and he has currently been serving on this board. He is, as I indicated, from Scottsbluff and is a civil engineer, and also brings expertise to the board. With that, Mr. Chairman, I would like to submit to the body those four names for confirmation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the opening on the confirmation report by Chairman Bromm. Open for discussion on that report. Seeing no lights on, Senator Bromm.
