Senator, do you wish to close on committee amendments? The question before the body is the committee amendments to LB 188. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 188. Adoption of the committee amendments, offered by Senator Brashear, Chairman of the Judiciary Committee. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, on the adoption of committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Committee amendments are adopted. Back to discussion on the bill itself, LB 188. Seeing no lights on, Senator Byars. Byars waives closing. Question before the body is advancement of LB 188 to E & R Initial. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the advancement of LB 188 to E & R Initial. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 188 does advance. Mr. Clerk, next item.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 545 was introduced by Senators Janssen, Burling, Cudaback, and Hudkins. (Read title.) The bill was read for the first time on January 11, 2001, referred to the General Affairs Committee. That committee reported the bill to General File with committee amendments attached. (AM0571, Legislative Journal page 716, First Session, 2001.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, you're recognized to open on LB 545.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, LB 545 was brought at the request of the Charitable Gaming Division of the Department of Revenue.
