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this, and I am going to vote for advancement. In the design-build phase we have, what I might describe as, the dueling architects. We've got an architect employed by the school and an architect employed by the...by the design-build firm and there is an argument made that you need both of them, and in fact one of them you can't fire without the written consent of the...now, if you go to the construction management at risk there's only one contract or one architect, as I understand it. So why...how is that possible? How is it possible in...in the one side you have to have two architects, and you really guarantee the continued employment of...of both of them, and the other one you can get by with...with only one?

SENATOR JENSEN: May I respond? Senator Raikes, first of all, when we say dueling architects I don't think that's necessarily true. First of all, the school board has entered into this project because they want a product at the end. They...they want a...they want a school or they want an addition, and they want it in a timely fashion. And so I...I think everybody wants the same thing. Now, we have that protection factor in there, but I...I certainly don't look for a...a dueling factor, where one is going to be challenging the other one's ability and their right. I...I think anytime you enter into a situation like this you're trying to bring everybody on the same page and produce an end product that is, first of all, very good quality; second, that will service the children that are going to be in a school; and third, be done in a timely manner. And so it's just a matter of the two different approaches, which one will be used, which one will not, I cannot comment on other than we do have a number there that must be attained before. And at that time, then, it comes back to the Legislature and we'll decide if we want to go further with this approach. So I think we have many safeguards in there. And...and like...they may be dueling, but one is a...one is a safeguard and I just don't think that's...that's something that you're going to be seeing throughout this project.
