SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, on February the 11th we were privileged to have the appointment of Mrs. Louise Bereuter to a position on the Nebraska Arts Council. That length of term is from November 19th of '01 to September 2nd of '02. She was not able to be present. Some of her qualifications are she has extensive...an extensive background in the arts. She was an art teacher in Arlington, Virginia, and later at Lincoln High. She is an artist and Senator Bromm was there to introduce her application to the Arts Council. She was unable to attend. It was unanimously supported. Mrs. Bereuter is a constituent of Senator Bromm.
