SENATOR ROBAK: I'm thinking of...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...but they could be expanded in size...

SENATOR ROBAK: Size.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...if...if the statutes we pass next year allow that, but they could also say they shall be of a certain size. We could do...we could do that too.

SENATOR ROBAK: And that doesn't bother me. I just wanted to clarify that in my mind...

SENATOR BEUTLER: You bet.

SENATOR ROBAK: ...so I know what the voters will be voting on. I notice also this year we're...there's some attempt to tax cigarettes, I can't remember how much a pack now, and also alcohol. Those that are opposed to...that support this concept, we're taxing sin, so to speak, philosophically, I don't believe in smoking or drinking either, but we're using the revenues. We're only too happy to have that, but for some reason philosophically we don't want gambling and use their revenues for our state, and I don't understand that either. Perhaps some day somebody will be able to explain that to me. I do support the LR 6CA. I'm thinking of supporting Beutler's amendment, but I'm a little hesitant because I don't know what's going to...this is going to do to the racetracks and so I'll have to look at that more closely. I do have a racetrack in my district. And, in closing, I'd just like to say a remark about Senator Chambers' experience with what he said. If those in charge cannot see fit to fire a teacher like that, then perhaps the Legislature will have to do something to see that the teacher gets fired. Just had to throw...
