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that there is no end to. It will be constantly. We always have before the committee more gambling operations, more expansion, and I think we did, a couple years ago, draw the line and said no more. We have keno. We have pickle cards. We have bingo. We have the lottery, and we said at that time, no, we're not going any further. Now everyone in the state certainly knew that there was a LR 6CA out there. We debated it last year. And so did that cause the petition process to get...to kick in gear, that we really felt that there were going to be now some casinos and they needed to get a piece of the pie and so they went to the petition process to...one from the bar owners to allow slot machines in liquor establishments, another one to allow slot machines in keno operations? It just doesn't end. Every time we add one, then we got the other group coming back and wanting their piece of the pie also. The pie is only so large. There's so much expendable dollars out there and I just think to expand this any further is a mistake. Horse racing at one time was a great product. It brought people into the state of Nebraska. Then, when other states got into horse racing, we saw ours decline. So then what do we come back with? Well, we need to have casinos within our racetracks. We fought that battle a couple years ago and it was denied here on the floor. I think we need to do the same thing at this time, at this juncture, to say, no, we're not going to expand gambling any more. Otherwise, we are just continually, continually adding more and more to this situation. With that, Mr. Speaker, I'll return the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature and Senator Janssen, I would like to ask Senator Janssen a question.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator, would you respond?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, was this proposal that you're offering as an amendment either a bill or a constitutional proposal?
