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the bill.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Bromm, you're recognized to open on the specific amendment.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. I was trying to get a little better explanation for Senator Beutler, but what I understand is that the only property the Department of Aeronautics still has is under a long-term lease and...and that they can't sell it and the...the purpose of an appraisal really doesn't...isn't relevant because they have this long-term lease with the federal government and so forth. So they...they felt it was unnecessary and that they have no opportunity to sell any of this property and haven't for a very long time. So if they were to somehow, if circumstances were to change and they would have to sell or would want to sell, it would take, I think, virtually an act of the Legislature to approve that. So I don't think there's any...I can't see any fear of removing the appraisal requirement. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, just one more quick question. They...they are leasing their property out to individual land...to different landowners or to...or is it just...I guess I don't know who they're leasing to and if I could engage Senator Bromm in just a couple of questions, Mr. Speaker. And if the leases are long term, I assume we would still expect them to reappraise before they renegotiated leases. Or am I thinking that I need to know more background on what the leases are or what we're talking about here?

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I...thank you, Senator Beutler. What I have been told is that they lease, like, to the FAA or the federal authorities on long-term arrangement and...

SENATOR BEUTLER: So all of the leases that we're talking about are to the federal government?

SENATOR BROMM: That's what I am told. Now, I don't know that first hand, I haven't seen the leases, but that's the
